All of our knowledgeable library staff continued to offer top quality service to you, our constituents, during the time we were without a permanent director. Thank you to all staff for your dedication and hard work.

The trustees remain sensitive to the realities of this period as we come out of a pandemic that has disrupted the economy. We have prepared a budget with no increase in the amount to be raised by taxes. Because of this, the residents don't have to vote on our annual budget for 2023-24, though there will be an election of one Trustee position.

RICHMOND MEMORIAL LIBRARY VOTING GUIDELINES

WHO MAY VOTE?

Residents of Batavia City School District who are citizens of the United States, eighteen years or older, and *are registered voters* may vote on this year's Trustee Election.

Eligible residents of the Batavia City School District who are not registered voters may come in to the library on **April 11th** between the hours of **1 o'clock pm - 5 o'clock pm** and **7 o'clock pm - 9 o'clock pm** to register to vote in this year's library vote.

WHAT ABOUT ABSENTEE BALLOTS?

Applications for absentee ballots are available at Richmond Memorial Library. If the ballot is to be mailed to the voter, the application must be received at the Richmond Memorial Library by 5 o'clock pm on **April 26th**. If the ballot is to be delivered personally to the voter, the application may be received up to 5 o'clock pm on **May 2nd**.

Message from Library Director, Beth Paine

"The only thing that you absolutely have to know, is the location of the library." Albert Einstein

Having moved multiple times around the state, this quote really has a special meaning for me. I have moved more than a few times, including moving from my "hometown" of Bloomfield, NY to Oswego for college, living in Rochester for two years after receiving my degree, on to Canandaigua, then Penn Yan, and then down to Sidney, NY in the Catskills region. And with each



new place where I have resided, one of the first things I would locate was the library. The library was always my happy place, the place where I knew I could relax and let my worries slip away. It was the place of amazing stories, knowledgeable people, and endless forms of entertainment.

My first, and probably best, memory of the library was going with my mother to our small public library in Bloomfield. To walk into that sanctuary of books and records brought a calm to my young mind that I experienced nowhere else. I will forever be grateful to my mother for introducing me to that wonderful place. And though it took me 43 years to realize that being a librarian was my true calling, I still get the same feeling of calm every time I walk into the building. And Richmond Library is my new happy place!

Though I did not actually experience the happenings at the Richmond Memorial Library in 2022, as I only arrived in late February, I did compile the 2022 Annual Report for NY State and have a good cache of knowledge regarding much of what occurred during the past year. While the effects of the pandemic can still be seen in the fact that the library's attendance still has not reached pre-COVID levels, there was an increase of about 30% in visitors to the library from 2021 to 2022. There was also a large increase in the number of items checked out, including all genres and formats. Programming has continued to show a huge uptick in attendance, 17x what we had in 2021! And as per usual, the Richmond Reads program had the highest attendance for adult programs, and Santa's in-person visit in December was by far the best attended Children's program of 2022.

Working diligently on the library budget with the Board of Trustees, we had many discussions regarding rising costs, not just for the library, but for our patrons, as well. With this in mind, the Board voted that the library would not raise the tax levy for the 2023-2024 fiscal year, and instead, hold steady at \$1,381,469. The Board feels that as these difficult times continue, the library should be a place of refuge from the storm, and that the library can absorb some of these price hikes so that our patrons do not have to.

Though the pandemic still has some lingering negative effects on our library usage statistics, we are coming back strong, and I am so thrilled to be a part of this new chapter at the Richmond Library. I have already come to love the library and I am constantly impressed by the knowledgeable and motivated staff that I have the privilege to work with every day. And now that I'm caught up on learning the ins and outs of the library, you'll see me out of my office more, so please feel free to stop me and say hi!
