RICHMOND MEMORIAL LIBRARY VOTING GUIDELINES

WHO MAY VOTE?

Residents of Batavia City School District who are citizens of the United States, eighteen years or older, and *are registered voters* may vote on this year's Budget Vote & Trustee Election.

Eligible residents of the Batavia City School District who are not registered voters may come in to the library on **April 9th** between the hours of **1 o'clock pm - 5 o'clock pm** and **7 o'clock pm - 9 o'clock pm** to register to vote in this year's library vote.

WHAT ABOUT ABSENTEE BALLOTS?

Applications for absentee ballots are available at Richmond Memorial Library. If the ballot is to be mailed to the voter, the application must be received at the Richmond Memorial Library by 5 o'clock pm on April 22nd. If the ballot is to be delivered personally to the voter, the application may be received up to 5 o'clock pm on April 28th.

Message from Board President 2024-2025 Budget year

The Richmond Memorial Library has seen another successful year thanks to our dedicated and community-focused staff and volunteers.

This year we saw increases in programs that engaged community members in a variety of activities. April's solar eclipse gathered patrons outside to enjoy viewing activities, games, and a local food truck. Musicians enlivened the historic reading room during every season of the year, and Richmond Reads delighted us with an engaging community-wide one book program that brought in Peter Heller, a nationally acclaimed author.

Our outreach programs, particularly for the children in our community continue to grow. The Books for Babies program, sponsored by the local Kiwanis club, delivers books to UMMC for distribution to new parents. Local enrollment in Dolly Parton's Imagination Library also continues to grow; this program gifts books each month free of charge to children from birth to age five.

This year we continued upgrading technology in the library, including computers available for patron used in the library. The digital sign was upgraded to an energy efficient LED system, and more Hotspots were brought online which allows patrons to reliably connect to the internet.

The trustees remain sensitive to the economy and the pressure inflation has on our households; the library is not immune to these same pressures and over the course of this year, we saw increases to the cost of services we provide. In developing the 2025-2026 budget, we took into

consideration these financial realities and made modest but prudent adjustments that will enable us to retain community services at the same level. While we continue to seek grants to offset some of our costs, there is no guarantee we will receive the same level of funding as we have in the past due to an increase in applications to these grant organizations. With this in mind, we are asking for a 2% increase in the amount raised by taxes and ask for your support in adopting our proposed budget.

The Richmond Memorial Library is an integral part of our community. The library staff and Board of Trustees are committed to our Mission and desire to make the library a safe and inviting place for the community to engage in the educational and recreational service the library provides.
